The last 3 digits of the file name, after the period, refer to the file format. So, 001.TIF would be the first file in the TIFF folder.

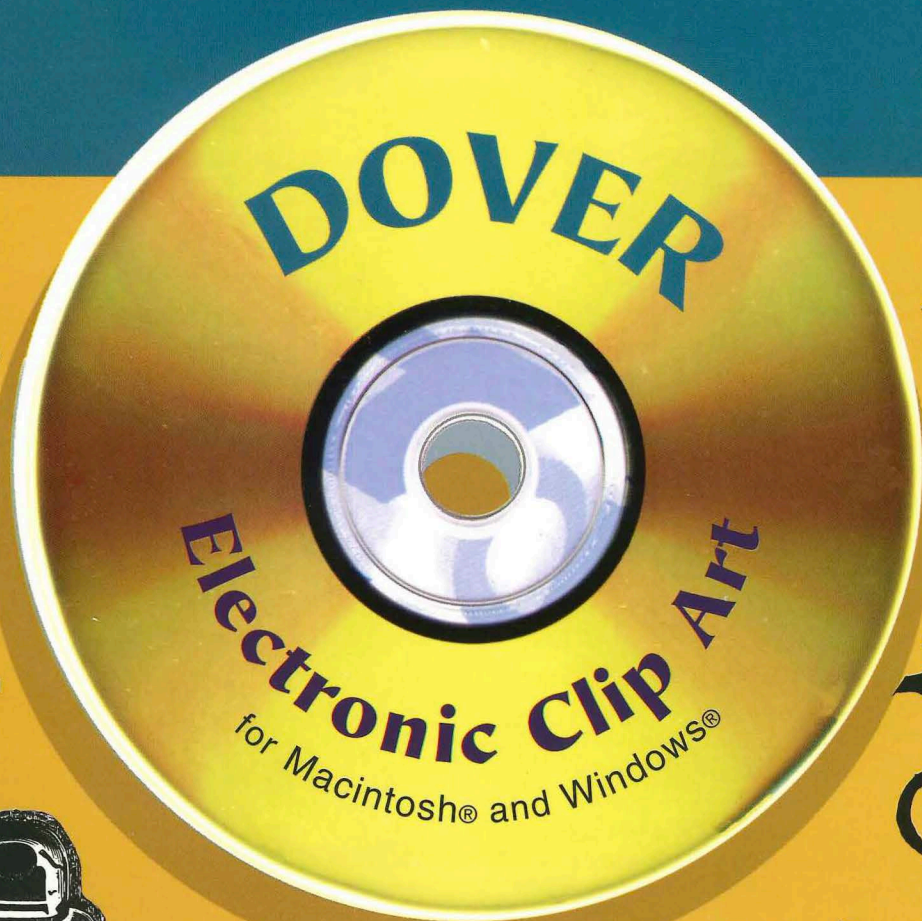

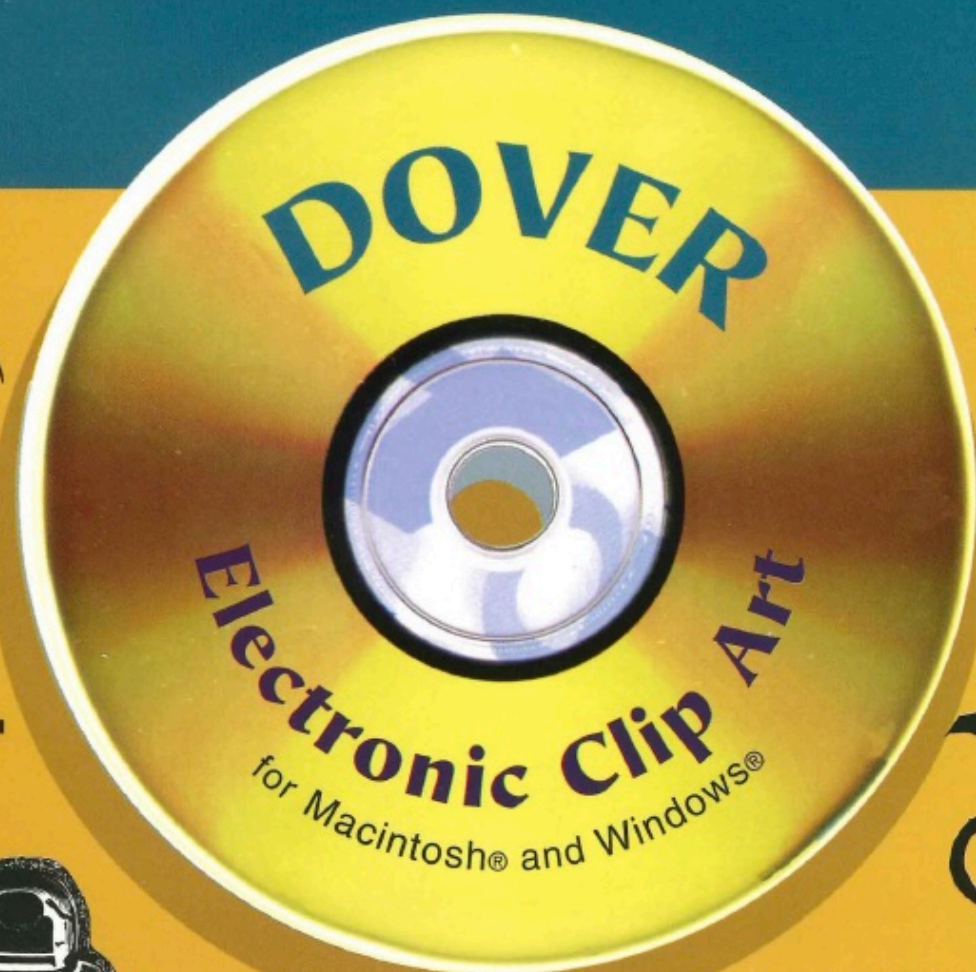
